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Anda Eglīte is a performer, composer, and arranger of plucked-string instruments. She is the head of the kokle and guitar classes at the prestigious *J. Vītols Latvian Academy of Music* in Riga, Latvia.

She is currently actively performing in Latvia and abroad as a solo musician, as well as a member of several chamber orchestras, among which the most notable is the contemporary classical music ensemble Altera Veritas. While performing with this group, Anda collaborated with numerous distinguished Latvian artists and symphony orchestras, and earned the highest award in Latvian music – the *Great Music Award* (2003), as well as the *Yearly Award in Culture* from the national daily newspaper *Diena* (2004), *Annual Folk Music Award* (2007), and *Baltais Zvirbulis Cultural Award of the Year* (2004, 2014). Along with her musical performance, Anda is actively involved with the creative life of the kokle musicians' community. She is the author and the artistic director of the kokle music winter festival *Kokle Sounds in Winter Sparkle*, the head conductor of multiple regional kokle music ensembles, and a regular performer at the many music festivals and concerts in Latvia, as well as at the world-famous *Latvian Song and Dance Festival*, which gathers more than fifteen thousand choir singers on a single night, an event declared by UNESCO as *Masterpiece of the Oral and Intangible Heritage of Humanity*.

In addition to her creative activities, Anda splits her time between her teaching of kokle music at *J. Vītols Latvian Academy of Music*, as well as at the *Joseph Medina Riga 1st Music School*, the *Art and Music School of the City of Olaine*, and serving as an Artistic Director of the kokle ensemble *Cantata*, which she also founded.



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Real instruments - Real sounds

No synthesizers, no samples, no loops, no Al-produced music, no instruments from libraries.

We believe in the unique energy of the sounds that come from real instruments produced with the hands of human beings. Our choice of instruments is varied, ranging from grand pianos to different acoustic guitars (some of them unique in the world), from harps to Kokle (ancient Latvian table harp), and from Bendir (ancient hand frame drum) to Handpan (tonal drum invented in the 2000s), and others, both traditional and less known acoustic instruments.

Hi-res from inception

All of our albums are recorded at 96k/32-bit floating (reduced to 24 bits at Mastering) using the highest quality audio equipment to date. All our recordings are available in Hi-Resolution (Studio Quality 96/24), Apple Digital Masters, and all our new releases are also available on Dolby ATMOS.
